“What ophthalmologists must know about conjunctival tumors”

Conjunctival tumors are a rare entity, with conjunctival melanoma presenting a particularly high risk of recurrence, especially when managed by ophthalmologists who are not specialized in these tumors. Historically, exenteration has been the last resort for tumors not controlled by excision and adjunctive treatments. However, in recent years, some patients have been spared from this disfiguring procedure through the successful use of immune checkpoint inhibitors.
